

## Pima County 4-H Shooting Sports



Thank you for interest in the Pima County 4-H Shooting Sports Project.

The 4-H Shooting Sports Project is a county wide project, with members participating through meetings run by 4-H community clubs. 4-H shooting sports are an integral part of the 4-H activities held at the county, state and national level.

The shooting sports meetings are supervised by adult volunteer leaders who have taken shooting sports training provided by the Arizona 4-H Shooting Sports organization. The statewide training is given by volunteers who have completed training provided by the National 4-H Shooting Sports Foundation.

The purpose of the Shooting Sports Project is youth development by developing safe habits, self-discipline, teamwork, and knowledge in a safe, family oriented, and encouraging environment. Shooting sports that are taught to members aged 9 to 18 include: archery, air rifle and pistol, smallbore (.22) rifle and pistol, shotgun, muzzleloading, and hunting. All of these disciplines are taught using materials prepared by the National 4-H Shooting Sports Foundation.

The culmination of the 4-H year in Pima County is the shooting sports competition held in conjunction with the Pima County Fair. Pima County 4-H shooters have also competed at the annual State 4-H Shooting Sports Event and at the National Invitational Shooting Sports Event. In the spirit of 4-H, competition is not the main goal, but provides incentive to excel and opportunity for shooters to test their skill.
